The funds raised through Earth Month activities will support the GRN Healthy Waters campaign which addresses the following issues across the Gulf of Mexico:

- **Protecting Our Waters** from harmful pollution including sewage. Utilizing the GRN's recently released citizen's guide entitled "Our Waters, Our Health," we will train and empower concerned citizens across the Gulf region to tackle sewage pollution issues in their communities.
- **Preserving and Protecting Wetlands** which help filter pollutants out of rivers and lakes. Wetlands also play a critical role in protecting communities from flooding and storm surge. The GRN works to prevent the destruction of wetlands so that future generations will know and love the Gulf we know today.
- **Empowering Citizens to Fight for Clean Water**
Over 60% of all streams and rivers in the United States ultimately drain into the Gulf of Mexico. In order to fight for clean water, citizens need reliable information and resources. The GRN works hard to educate and assist community groups fighting to prevent the pollution of local waters.
- **Reducing the Dead Zone.** Up to 210 million pounds of fertilizer run off makes its way into the Gulf every year. This polluted run off creates a lifeless, oxygen-starved Dead Zone up to 8,000 square miles in size and may contribute to longer and more intense red tide outbreaks in Florida. The GRN works in collaboration with organizations along the Mississippi River – from Minnesota to Louisiana – to push for the reduction of Dead Zone-causing pollution from agricultural runoff, factory farms, sewage treatment plants, and industrial facilities.

We, at the GRN, are excited about this opportunity to educate the public and raise support for our Healthy Waters campaign in across the Gulf. We thank you for participating in Earth Month and your dedication to a healthy Gulf!
